

About iTeach

Early this summer, a small group of faculty will converge for a week of intensive work on a course intended for fall or spring delivery (2013-2014).

The dates of iTeach are June 3 to June 7. Actual work on your online course will alternate with informational short workshops, showcases, and always, supportive help to walk you through every step. One-on-one instruction, guidance and coaching will be available when needed.

iTeach Sitka is based on a UAF model which provides opportunities for small groups of faculty to develop their online courses with a supportive group of like-minded faculty. Support staff will teach, coach, guide and mentor you through the various steps of course development.

iTeach will run for 5 days, 8 hours a day. Lunch, coffee, and snacks will be provided to keep your energy up! Because of the intensity of the program, only a small group will be able to participate. Faculty and adjunct faculty who teach UAS courses are eligible to apply. Participants who are accepted must commit to the entire 5 days of work. A \$500 stipend is awarded for full participation (Juneau and Ketchikan faculty must make this arrangement with their own campus).

All we need is the following information:


- Your name, course number and title.
